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Executive Summary of Self Assessment Reports

BNU strives hard to deliver quality education and has never compromised on its quality standards. Quality Assurance Department (QA) was setup in BNU in September 2005 as per directives of HEC and since then has actively worked for the quality of all academic programs offered at BNU. One of the important steps in this process is the Self Assessment of the Academic Programs.

Self-Assessment Report (SAR) is an effective tool in measuring and monitoring the outcome of a program. This is employed in Degree Awarding Institutes of Pakistan to identify strengths and weaknesses of the degree programs. Self Assessment Reports are prepared at the end of the assessment cycle of all academic programs at Beaconhouse National University (BNU).

QA department at BNU attempts to furnish the requisite information to complete Self Assessment Report in the light of certain criteria and standards as spelled out in the Self Assessment Manual prepared by HEC.

To complete the second cycle of Assessment in the year 2019-2021, fifteen degree programs were selected for Self Assessment, evaluation and improvements.

Objectives

Objectives of the Self Assessment report are:

1. To improve and maintain academic standards.
2. To verify that existing programs meet their objectives and institutional goals.
3. To provide feedback for the academic program.
4. To identify areas requiring improvements in order to achieve objectives through desired outcomes.

Execution of Self Assessment Process:

Presentations on the preparation of Self Assessment Report (SAR) were arranged for all Schools and faculty members of the selected program. This also served to explain the Self Assessment process and also a soft and hard copy of self assessment manual were also provided to further aid the process.

To initiate the SAR process, the Dean appoints the Program Team and Assessment Team Members to prepare the report in the subsequent weeks. Once completed, the Report is submitted to the Assessment team and QA department. The Assessment Team, accompanied with GM (QA) review the report with Dean and Program Team Members and concerned faculty.

The program weaknesses and strengths are identified in the final meeting. Solutions and Implementation plans are prepared based on the discussions. The following are discussed.

- c. Responsible Body for corrective actions
- d. Implementation Date

The recommended target dates to complete the tasks observed by Assessment Team, were approved by Vice Chancellor.

Introduction

The Institute of Psychology grew out of the Department of Applied Psychology established at BNU, in 2004. The Institute is running successfully the following academic programs: B.Sc. (Hons) Applied Psychology, M.Sc.in Applied Areas of Psychology, MS Clinical and Counseling Psychology, M.Phil. in applied areas of Psychology and PhD. Over and above, the core courses in the discipline of Psychology, the Institute offers innovative courses that promote independent critical thinking among the students. For example, courses such as Current Debates in Psychology, Seminars on indigenous Psychosocial Issues and specialized workshops conducted by practicing psychologists in the field. Over the years, these programs have motivated the students to actively carry out research on indigenous issues under the guidance of expert supervisors. The Research output of the Institute is impressive and publications of the faculty and the students appear regularly in National and International Research Journals of repute. 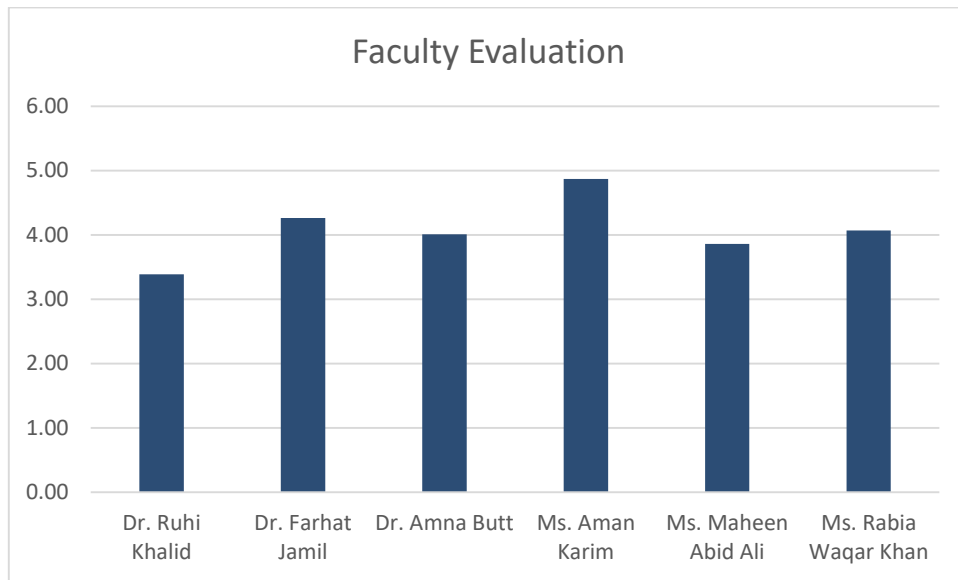

Curriculum Breakdown

First Semester

PSY 756 Child Psychopathology

This course will be an in-depth study of the literature dealing with social, emotional, and behavioral disorders in children and adolescents as categorized in DSM-5. Current theories, research and their implications for clinical practice will be examined. In addition, theoretical and methodological advances related to research on risk and protective factors and their influence on issues such as early school dropout, juvenile delinquency, substance abuse, and adolescent suicide, will be critically examined.

PSY 709 Clinical Skills: Assessment and Diagnosis for Children

This course explores the theory and practice of cognitive and personality assessment for children, with an emphasis on evidence-based measures. This course aims to introduce the concept of psychological assessment and enhancing practical experience of administration, scoring and interpretation of different kinds of tests. The ultimate objective is to enable students to write an assessment report in clinical context. It also aims to develop sensitivity to the ethical and cultural considerations in working with children.

PSY 702 Current Trends in Assessment and Psychotherapy - I

This course will be offered with the adult specific topics differing depending on the instructor and student interests as well as important areas under discussion in other courses (e.g., psychotic disorders; substance abuse disorders; quantitative and qualitative research, interpersonal psychotherapy, etc.).

PSY 715 Psychological Intervention and Counseling Needs I

This course aims to familiarize students with the therapeutic interventions utilized to treat childhood psychopathologies. It intends to develop analytical and evaluative skills to compare and contrast theoretical and research concepts in childhood psychopathology and also develops insight into the diverse issues in indigenous childhood psychopathology research.

Second Semester

PSY 759 Adult Psychopathology

This course will be an intensive study of the literature dealing with social, emotional, and behavioral disorders in adults. Contemporary theories and research and their implications for clinical practice will be examined. In addition, theoretical and methodological advances related to research on a wide range of psychological disorders, including anxiety disorders, mood disorders, somatic symptoms, psychotic

disorders, eating disorders, personality disorders, sexual and gender identity disorders, substance use disorders etc will be focused.

PSY 830 Clinical Skills: Assessment and Diagnosis for Adults

This course explores the theory and practice of comprehensive psychological assessment for adults, with an emphasis on evidence-based measures. Instruction in cognitive assessment will include intellectual assessment methods, neuropsychological measures and personality assessment training. Issues related to ethics in assessment are also covered. The ultimate objective is to enable students to write an assessment report in clinical setup.

PSY 835 Psychological Intervention and Counseling Needs II

This course provides an overview of theory and practice of evidence-based, psychological and biological treatments for a wide range of psychological disorders, including anxiety disorders, mood disorders, somatoform disorders, psychotic disorders, eating disorders, personality disorders, sexual and gender identity disorders, substance use disorders, cognitive disorders, and others.

PSY 708 Clinical Training-I: Child Placement

Supervised clinical placement in a community setting approved by the Director of Institute of Psychology will be an integral part of the program. This clinical training is required of all students in the MS in Clinical and Counseling Psychology program. It will provide training in child specific clinical assessment and intervention under the close supervision of one or more registered clinical psychologists and psychiatrists in a community setting.

PSY714 Case Conference – I

This course will equip students with skills of writing up and presenting clinical case reports. It will also facilitate application of knowledge about child psychopathologies' assessment, diagnosis, and therapeutic management along with the development of critical thinking styles while working with child population in clinical settings.

Third Semester

PSY 840 Contemporary Research Methodologies and Formulating Research Proposal

This course offers a review of research methods in clinical and counseling psychology, including issues related to design, measurement, and interpretation. Topics to be covered include research in test construction and psychometrics, experimental and observational methods in clinical research, single case experimental designs, qualitative research, research ethics, and diverse issues in clinical research, among others.

PSY804 Clinical Training – II: Adult Placement

Supervised clinical placement in a community setting approved by the Director of Institute of Psychology will be an integral part of the program. This clinical training is required of all students in the MS in Clinical and Counseling Psychology program. It will provide training in adult specific clinical assessment and intervention under the close supervision of one or more registered clinical psychologists and psychiatrists in a community setting.

PSY802 Current Trends in Assessment and Psychotherapy – II

This course will be offered with the child specific topics differing depending on the instructor and student interests as well as important areas under discussion in other courses (e.g., neurodevelopmental disorders; IEP development; contemporary child specific therapeutic approaches, etc.).

PSY806 Case Conference-II

This course will equip students with skills of writing up and presenting clinical case reports. It will also facilitate application of knowledge about adult psychopathologies' assessment, diagnosis, and therapeutic management along with the development of critical thinking styles while working with adult population in clinical settings.

Fourth Semester:

PSY855 Research Thesis

Students will carry out an extensive one-year research on a clinical/counseling psychology topic. They will develop the research methodology for their research project under the guidance and assistance of their supervisor and will present the final research project in the form of a thesis.

PSY 805 Clinical Training - III: Area of Specialization

Supervised clinical placement in a community setting approved by the Director of Institute of Psychology will be an integral part of the program. This specialization training is required of all students in the MS in Clinical and Counseling Psychology program. It will provide training in specialization specific clinical assessment and intervention under the close supervision of one or more registered clinical psychologists and psychiatrists in a community setting.

PSY 807 Case Conference-III

This course will equip students with skills of writing up and presenting clinical case reports. It will also facilitate application of knowledge about psychopathologies' assessment, diagnosis, and therapeutic management in their specialization area. Along with this this course will aid in the development of critical thinking styles and enhance awareness among students that personal biases and countertransference issues could potentially interfere with process of problem identification and management.

PSY 809 Professional and Ethical Issues

Psychologists are expected to respect and protect civil and human rights and the central importance of freedom of inquiry and expression in research, publication, testing, supervision, assessment, diagnosis, counseling and psychotherapy. This course focuses on the welfare and protection of the individuals and groups with whom psychologists work. It also aims at educating the students regarding ethical standards of the discipline. This course is intended to provide specific ethical standards to cover most situations encountered by psychologists in research and practice.

Students are trained to use SPSS and AMOS software for statistical analysis of research data and End Note software for referencing in research.

Students are required to complete written case reports and give oral presentations to enhance their oral and written communication skills which are employed during “Clinical training” and “Research: Formulating Research Proposal” courses where they are required to present and defend their clinical case reports and research topics.

Criterion 3: LABORATORIES AND COMPUTING FACILITIES

The Institute of Psychology has following laboratories:

1. One Psychological Testing Laboratory with up-to-date psychological tests in the following domains:
 - Diagnostic Tests
 - Intelligence Tests
 - Aptitude Tests
 - Personality Tests
 - Neuropsychological Tests
2. One Experimental Lab with updated equipment for conducting psychology experiments.
3. Social Psychology Lab with one-way mirror for observation.
4. Computer Lab containing 25 workstations equipped with desktop computers along with Multimedia and internet facilities. The computer lab is equipped with adequate facilities for carrying out data analysis and research work.

Standard 3-1: Laboratory manuals/documentation/instructions for experiments must be available and readily accessible to faculty and students.

The above-mentioned lab helps the students in carrying our psychological assessment relating to the courses offered in MS in Clinical and Counseling Psychology. The course instructors teach exercises in different therapeutic modalities and assessment and interpretation using variety of psychological tests. Moreover, each test also contains a manual, which carry details of administration, scoring and interpretation of the test.

Standard 3-2: There must be adequate support personnel for instruction and maintaining the

laboratories.

Two Lab Assistants in addition to the primary course instructor who are responsible for providing access to various psychological tests and are required to ensure that networking of the computers is working properly and Internet is available at each workstation maintain the above lab. Moreover, these lab assistants are also responsible for the maintenance of apparatus for carrying out psychological experiments.

Standard 3-3: The University computing infrastructure and facilities must be adequate to support program's objectives.

The facilities mentioned in the above lab are adequate to support the objectives of the program. In addition, Psychology student's also have access to the primary Computer LAB of the IT Department which has 25 workstations equipped with latest soft wares for internet searching and statistical analysis.

Criterion 4: STUDENT SUPPORT AND ADVISING

The Institute of Psychology realizes the importance of providing continuous support and guidance to its students. As a result guidance and counseling groups are assigned to each faculty member, students can contact their guidance group advisor any time during university hours and the guidance group advisor makes every effort to address and resolve the student's query/problem in a timely manner.

Standard 4-1: Courses must be offered with sufficient frequency and number for students to complete the program in a timely manner.

The MS in Clinical and Counseling Psychology program comprises of fifteen courses spread over two years (4 semesters) of full time study.

Generally 3 to 4 courses are offered in each semester which constitutes a study load of 10 to 16 credit hours.

Standard 4-2: Courses in the major area of study must be structured to ensure effective interaction between students, faculty and teaching assistants.

There is open communication and interaction between the course instructor and the students during each semester. Students can not only ask questions during classes but the permanent faculty is also available in their offices from 9:30 am to 3:30 pm during which students can approach them and discuss their issues. Moreover the visiting faculty is also required to give 1-2 hours to student's queries in addition to teaching.

Standard 4-3: Guidance on how to complete the program must be available to all students and access to academic advising must be available to make course decisions and career choices.

Information relating to each degree program, its timeline, distribution of courses per semester are updated and published every year in the Prospectus of the university which is not only available in hardcopy format but is also uploaded on BNU's website and each school's individual page.

In addition, an orientation session is held at the beginning of each academic year where students are provided with details of the degree program, criteria for evaluation, credit hour requirement, course breakups etc. Student's queries are also addressed in orientation session. Moreover, students are also given disciplinary rules and examination regulation handbooks during the orientation session.

The director, institute of Psychology along with the faculty members and coordinators are available to provide guidance to the students and to address their academic, personal as well as psychological issues if any.

Every effort is made to satisfy the student's queries and provide solution to his / her problems. Almost all visiting faculty members are professionals and specialists in their fields and students have many opportunities to interact with them and discuss their academic and professional queries and seek career guidance.

In addition the Institutes organizes seminars, workshops and extension lectures by prominent Psychologists and Psychiatrists in the field, so student will not only have a chance to learn from experts but also be able to meet and develop liaisons with potential future employers.

Moreover, students are also timely informed through notice board and face book about seminars and conferences taking place at different educational Institutes, so they can come to know of the indigenous work being carried out in Pakistan and develop professional liaisons with their counterparts studying in various psychology departments all over Pakistan.

Criterion 5: PROCESS CONTROL

Standard 5-1: The process by which students are admitted to the program must be based on quantitative and qualitative criteria and clearly documented. This process must be periodically evaluated to ensure that it is meeting its objectives.

PROGRAM ADMISSION CRITERIA

To be eligible for admission in MS Clinical and Counseling Psychology, a candidate must have good academic record with M.A/M.Sc. (2 years program) or B.Sc. Honors (4 years program) in Psychology from a well established and HEC recognized university. Moreover, the candidate will have to qualify the NTS (GAT) test prior to the admission in MS Clinical and Counseling Psychology. Criterion for admission in the MS Program is kept in strict accordance with the guidelines set by the Higher Education Commission. Applicants who meet the academic criteria will take an entrance test by the Institute. On clearance of the test, they will be interviewed for final admission.

PROGRAM/ CREDIT TRANSFER

The Institute refers all transfer cases to the University Equivalence Committee. The Equivalence Committee, after thorough scrutiny in light of the HEC guidelines, gives approval for all transfers.

EVALUATION OF ADMISSION CRITERIA

The admission criterion is reviewed annually in light of the HEC guidelines. The Board of Studies meets twice a year and reviews all matters regarding the program. In addition, Academic Council of the University also reviews the Admission procedure and subsequent approval is taken from the Board of Governors of the University

Standard 5-2: The process by which students are registered in the program and monitoring of

students' progress to ensure timely completion of the program must be documented This process must be periodically evaluated to ensure that it is meeting its objectives.

PROCESS OF REGISTRATION

The process of registration being followed at the Institute of Psychology is done online through the university's Campus Management System. In addition to online registrations, the coordinator under the supervision of the Dean of the School keeps a record of the student registration. This includes the registration on the program and the courses through course enrollment form, ADD/Drop form and Course Withdrawal Form. In addition, the students' course enrollments, Add/Drop of courses and course withdrawals are also done online through the Campus Management System. This record is accessible by the Institute of Psychology, the Registrar of the University and the Quality Assurance Department.

MONITORING STUDENTS PROGRESS

The student progress is carefully monitored throughout their academic stay at the Institute. The program follows continuous assessment procedures. The results of the students are carefully recorded online in the Campus Management System, monitored by the Institute, and passed on to the Examination and Quality Assurance Department. The faculty, Head of Department and the Dean meet on a regular basis to discuss all student related issues. The Institute through the Campus Management System also maintains attendance records, class performance records including quiz, assignments, and mid-term and End of Year Examination marks of all students. Transcripts are prepared by the Examination Department at the end of every semester. These transcripts are mailed to the students at the end of the semester. In addition, the students can also view their transcripts and academic progress online through the Campus Management System.

EVALUATION AND IMPROVEMENT

The process is evaluated in the faculty meetings and periodic meetings of coordinators and the Head of Department.

Standard 5-3: The process of recruiting and retaining highly qualified faculty members must be in place and clearly documented. In addition, processes and procedures for faculty evaluation, promotion must be consistent with institution mission statement. These processes must be periodically evaluated to ensure that it is meeting with its objectives.

The process of hiring qualified faculty at all levels (i.e. lecturers, assistant professors, associate professors etc.) is kept in strict accordance with the criteria set by HEC and BNU. Applicants who meet the minimum criteria are interviewed by the Director IP and are asked to give mock lectures. The names of the candidates are then recommended to the selection board, which comprises of the Vice Chancellor and the Board of Governors of BNU then interviews the candidates to give the final approval.

Selected faculties is offered competitive salary packages as recommended by HEC and are encouraged to improve their qualification and number of publications by carrying out research projects on topics of their interest.

Faculty evaluation by students and their own evaluation of their performance are obtained at the end of each semester and are communicated to the faculty so that they can improve upon their weaknesses.

Promotions are based on successfully fulfilling the criteria set by HEC, upon completion of which the Dean recommends the faculty members name for promotion to the Vice Chancellor.

Standard 5-4: The process and procedures used to ensure that teaching and delivery of course material to the students emphasizes active learning and that course learning outcomes are met. The process must be periodically evaluated to ensure that it is meeting its objectives.

Faulty and Course Evaluation Performas provided by HEC are filled for each faculty member and course at the end of every semester and evaluations are then entered in computer and the entire data is sent to Quality Assurance Department for further processing. The QA department then prepares the summary for each course and faculty member and this summary is presented to the Dean, who then discusses it with the concerning faculty members. This ensures faculty improvement for the next courses.

These evaluations objectively identify whether the course has met the specified learning outcomes and whether the method used for teaching the course was interactive and effective. These evaluations further specify the strengths and weaknesses for each faculty member and provide them with an opportunity to work on their weaknesses. Based on these evaluations faculty members take necessary action to overcome any problems faced by students and devise ways to enhance students understanding of the course.

Standard 5-5: The process that ensures that graduates have completed the requirements of the program must be based on standards, effective and clearly documented procedures. This process must be periodically evaluated to ensure that it is meeting its objectives.

The office of Institute of Psychology maintains complete records of the students. These records are reviewed at the start and end of every semester to ensure the student is progressing and meeting all requirements of the program. The Registrar office and Quality Assurance department also maintain files on each student. These files contain past and ongoing academic record of the students. At the end of each semester these records are reviewed as a means to check student performance.

In addition the examination department send result summaries of the graduating batch many times before and during their last year of the degree program so that students can be informed timely if they are short of any requirement and are also advised how to complete these requirements in order to complete their degree requirement on time .

Criterion 6: FACULTY

Faculty members must be current and active in their discipline and have the necessary technical depth and breadth to support the program. There must be enough faculty members to provide continuity and stability, to cover the curriculum adequately and effectively, and to allow for scholarly activities. To meet this criterion the standards in this section must be satisfied.

Standard 6-1: There must be enough full time faculties who are committed to the program to provide adequate coverage of the program areas/courses with continuity and stability. The interests and qualifications of all faculty members must be sufficient to teach all courses, plan, modify and update courses and curricula. All faculty members must have a level of competence that would normally be obtained through graduate work in the discipline. The majority of the faculty must hold a Ph.D. in the discipline.

Standard 6-2: All faculty members must remain current in the discipline and sufficient time must be provided for scholarly activities and professional development. Also, effective programs for faculty development must be in place.

All faculty members at the Institute of Psychology at the minimum have either an MS/M.Phil. degree (local) or Masters Degree (foreign) in different sub-fields of psychology. The faculty is encouraged to update their knowledge by attending professional training courses and workshops and reading latest books and researches published in their respective specialized areas of psychology. They are also encouraged to enhance their qualification by means of faculty development program in which faculty is offered scholarships to pursue higher degrees such as PhD program.

The full time faculty members are assigned a maximum load of three courses, which entails 9 to 12 semester credit hour of student contact. Keeping in view this load the fulltime faculty has sufficient time for professional development. Moreover, faculty is encouraged to participate in seminars, workshops and conferences in the area of their interest.

Standard 6-3: All faculty members should be motivated and have job satisfaction to excel in their profession.

BNU offers a congenial working environment for its faculty which is conducive for teaching and research. Faculty offices are air-conditioned and are provided with individual workstations with internet access.

Faculty have access to all the books at BNU library in addition to HEC's digital library, they have access to latest research articles on JSTOR and Springer link etc. Faculty is also encouraged to undertake professional development and training at discounted rates, subject to providing a service bond.

In addition they are also encouraged to attend workshops to learn about the advancement in their fields of interest and to equip themselves with the use of newer and newer technology and data analysis techniques.

Faculty appraisals are also carried out annually and increments are awarded subject to the appraisal. All

the above features help in motivating the faculty and enhancing their job satisfaction. Research publication incentive is also provided to faculty in order to motivate them to publish their work.

Criterion 7: INSTITUTIONAL FACILITIES

Standard 7-1: The institution must have the infrastructure to support new trends in learning such as e-learning.

• BNU HOSTEL

The construction of BNU Hostels is complete and a state-of-art, purpose-built, on-campus boarding facility is ready and available for occupancy of 74 girls and 80 boys. BNU Hostel compound is a 42,000 sq.ft. Segregated wings for girls and boys. Each wing of the facility has appropriately equipped common rooms, pantries on each floor, a visitor's lounge and a laundry.

An adjoining facility to cater to the accommodation needs of international faculty is near completion.

• LIBRARY

The BNU Library remains open from 9:00 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. daily, Monday to Friday and for a specific number of hours on Saturday as well. A full-time librarian and assistants provide library information and access. Photocopying facilities are available at cost five days a week, 9:00 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. daily at the student resource center.

▪ BNU Library Space Relocation Project

The first phase of BNU Library relocation project to its original planned location conducted successfully in

September 2019. Three graduating students of the BNU School of Architecture, Ar. Shahbaz Zafar, Ar. Fahad Rizwan and Ar. Kashif Moaz under the supervision and support from the BNU Student Affairs and Procurement Departments developed the interior and floor plans. Our well-stocked facility now occupies a considerable 7,000 square feet of space with spacious reading areas and an extended reference section.

- **COMPUTER LABS**

All computer labs with access to Internet, scanning and printing (colour & b/w) from 9:00 am. to 6:30 pm. daily Monday to Friday.

- **SPORTS CLUB**

BNU encourages student participation in extracurricular activities and regularly hosts concerts, exhibitions, film screenings and other cultural events. The Sports Club of BNU promotes sports activities among the students by organizing matches throughout the year among different departments as well as with other universities and colleges.

- **STUDENT & ALUMNI AFFAIRS**

The Student Affairs Office under the Directorate of Student Affairs and External Relations coordinates with university's non-academic units for timely resolution of issues brought up by students (cafeteria, transport, hostels and related matters) besides providing support in holding co-curricular activities and ensuring students' co-curricular participation at events outside the university. It also maintains liaison with the university's alumni for their facilitation and assistance wherever needed.

The responsibilities of the department are as follows:

- Conduct orientation and guidance services for new entrants to acquaint them with University life and rules.
- Attend to student grievances and provide support for early resolution of student problems and issues.
- Support and facilitate co-curricular activities by student society's and clubs such as BNU Bestival, BNU Model United Nations (BUMUN) etc.
- Maintain the alumni network (graduate email database) and organize on-campus activities including meet-ups and homecomings.

- **VIRTUAL HEALTH CENTER**

BNU offers a primary care facility to its students, faculty and staff through its on-campus Virtual Health Centre (VHC) in partnership between iHeal and Cloudclinic. The Clinic provides services of regular checkup and basic medical screening to BNU faculty, staff and students. The Clinic is manned by trained nursing staff with the availability of an online panel of general physicians where patients can connect with them face-to-face in real-time via video screen upon request or requirement.

The purpose of VHC is to provide primary care on campus, screen for underlying risks for diabetes and hypertension, provide medical advice, monitor and manage basic health and refer to specialist care where required. Students can get their Blood Pressure, Blood Sugar, Body Mass Index (BMI), Body Temperature, Pulse and Eye Vision evaluated. VHC then creates a wellness profile of each student against a unique ID number which is stored with the Clinic for future visits. Based on any irregularities, a student may be advised appropriate course of action by the medical team. All screenings and visits to the clinic are optional and free-of cost for students.

- **CENTER FOR COUNSELING AND PSYCHOLOGICAL WELL-BEING**

BNU considers the emotional health of student and staff as its top priority. It has established an on-campus Center for Counseling and Psychological Well-being with support from BNU Institute of Psychology. The center aims to provide students with services to help them gain and maintain psychological well-being, featuring a qualified Psychologist on board as the Campus Counselor. Students can seek help from our trained professional in complete confidence regarding any personal, social or other crises they may be facing and discuss the same in a supportive and secure environment. The aim of the Center is to encourage students' personal, academic & social growth, enhance their problem-solving and decision-making capabilities and to ultimately enable them to face various life challenges in a wholesome manner.

- **CAFETERIA AND RESOURCE CENTER**

The BNU cafeteria block is a three-story well-furnished facility spread on 18000 sq. ft. area and with seating capacity for over 3000 persons at a time. The basement and the ground floor are completely operational while the upper ground floor is reserved for special occasions and gala buffet events. A cafeteria quality assurance committee with representatives from faculty and management ensures maintenance of highest standards in quality and hygiene and diversity of cuisine at economical prices through surprise visits and regular in-person meetings with the cafeteria management and staff. Periodic

medical health examination and diagnostic tests of chefs and waiters is conducted.

• **CAREER PLACEMENT OFFICE**

BNU has established a Career Placement Office under the Directorate of Student Affairs and External Relations that serves Career Placement needs of students and graduates. The services include Academic Counseling, Professional Counseling, Job Placement, internship facilitation and enabling students for self-employment and start-up business opportunities.

The responsibilities of this department include the following services:

- Undertake career counseling of prospective applicants as well as parents during admissions cycle.
- Provide career guidance services to students, facilitate internship programs and build liaison with industry for job placements.
- Conduct Job Fairs, Recruitment Drives, Employer Meet-ups, and Screening Interviews for graduates and graduating students.
- Develop and maintain a graduate directory of recent graduates.
- Liaise with the United States Education Foundation in Pakistan and British Council, UK and explore other international education opportunities for students and keeping them informed on international fellowships and scholarship
- Extend support for international exchange semesters and summer (Turkey, USA, Germany etc.)
- Facilitate start-up incubation at Plan9 Technology Incubator, The Indus Entrepreneurs (TiE) Lahore Chapter, NetSol Nspire Program, National Incubation Center, The Nest
- I/O, WomenX Pakistan for mentoring of students and alumni to capitalize on their entrepreneurial potential.

The Institute of Psychology offers competitive salaries to its faculty in addition to the following benefits i.e. Provident Fund, Annual Leave, Medical Leave, and Medical Insurance.

The Institute allocates sufficient budget for faculty development programs. Separate budget is kept for research based activities and for faculty participation in workshops, conferences etc. thus supporting the

faculty in carrying out teaching and research based activities.

Moreover Institute of Psychology has 1 coordinator and 2 Lab assistants to handle administrative tasks so that faculty can devote more time to teaching and research projects.

The Institute of Psychology has been running the MS and M.Phil Programs since 2008 with average intake of 20-25 students per year. In addition the Institute launched its PhD program in 2011, currently 2 students are enrolled in the PhD program and have completed their coursework requirements and working on their dissertations with many more applying to enroll for PhD program at the Institute of Psychology. Since the launch of the PhD program, 3 students have been awarded PhD degrees. The department has one Research Assistant who is responsible for assisting the research supervisor with the student's research work.

With the staff to student ratio of 1:20 the institute has been able to provide high quality education and guidance to its graduates students leading to increase in the number of applicants every year.
