2. Candidates will have a maximum of 1.5 hours (90 minutes) to complete the test.
3. All answers must be entered and submitted electronically through the testing system provided during the test.
4. Candidates are advised to read each question carefully before selecting or typing their response. Once submitted, responses may not be editable.
5. The use of any unauthorized material or digital/data storage device (e.g., mobile phones, smart watches, tablets, or electronic notes) is strictly prohibited during the test.

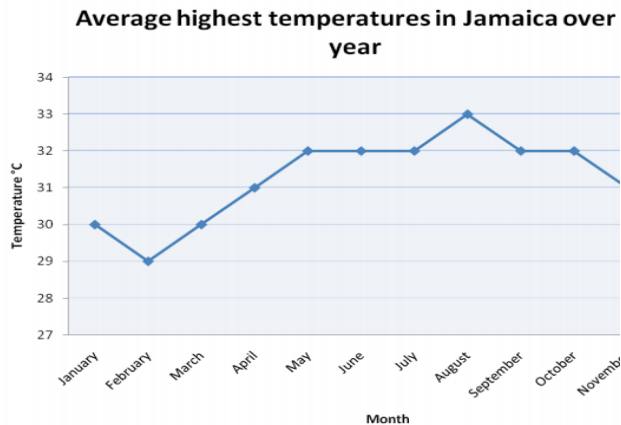


## SECTION 1: QUANTITATIVE<sup>1</sup>
